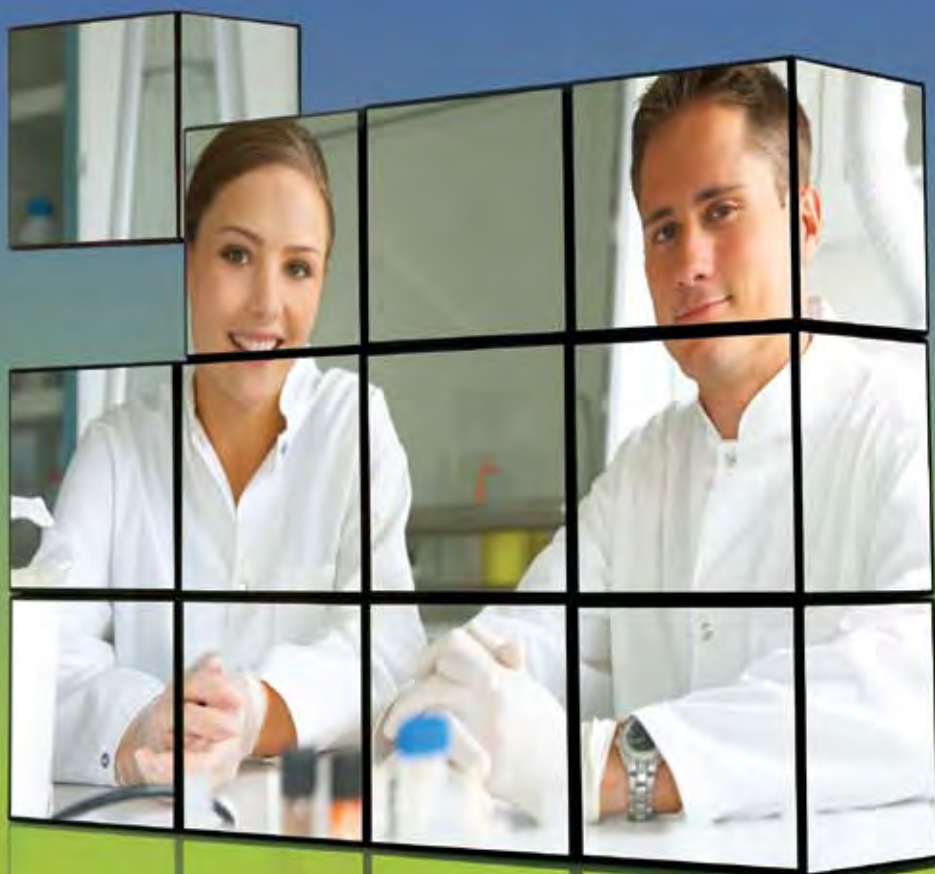

GENERAL INFORMATION

Introduction

The MPA Annual Convention & Exposition (ACE) will once again be held at the exciting Marriott Hotel at the Renaissance Center in Detroit, Mich. You will not want to miss attending Michigan's leading event for pharmacy professionals Feb. 26-28, 2010! Pharmacists, residents, pharmacy technicians and student pharmacists will have the opportunity to earn live continuing education credit, network during special events and enjoy activities in the center of Detroit's entertainment district.

Target Audience

Programs at the ACE were planned to meet the needs of pharmacists, residents, pharmacy technicians and student pharmacists in a variety of practice settings, as well as those in the pharmaceutical industry and academia.

Convention Goals

Over the years, the ACE has grown in magnitude and has become the event that pharmacy professionals look forward to attending every year. The ACE is the largest state pharmacy association convention in the country, with more than 1,300 attending the 2009 ACE. MPA is proud that the ACE is often compared to national pharmacy conventions and meetings.

MPA's goals for the ACE include the following:

- Provide quality continuing education programs, focusing on the latest treatment options and hottest issues in pharmacy
- Offer various networking options for attendees
- Facilitate opportunities for attendees to discuss the outlook of pharmacy
- Celebrate the future of pharmacy by honoring Michigan's pharmacy leaders
- Provide opportunities for attendees to continue their professional development

Location and Hotel Accommodations

The ACE will be held at the Detroit Marriott at the Renaissance Center. Participants of the ACE are responsible for making their own hotel reservations. Room rates at the Detroit Marriott are \$127 for single or double occupancy. Reservations should be made prior to Feb. 9, 2010, to receive the special convention rate and to guarantee availability. Call the Detroit Marriott directly at (800) 228-9290, and inform the reservation clerk that you are attending the MPA Annual Convention & Exposition to guarantee the convention rate, or go online at Marriott.com and enter group code mpampaa.

Parking at the Renaissance Center

Coupons for a generous \$4 discount off the daily parking rate will be made available at the convention registration desk each day to individuals parking in the Beaubien Place Parking Garage.

Self-parking

Be sure to park at the Beaubien Place Parking Garage, the deck with the blue signs. This is the only parking place where you will receive discount coupons for daily parking, which you can pick up at the convention registration desk.

- Location: On the east side of Beaubien St., just before reaching Atwater Drive and the Detroit River.
- What to look for: Blue signs.
- Cost: With the \$4 discount coupon, \$8 on Friday and \$1 on Saturday and Sunday.
- How to access the Renaissance Center: Cross over on the second level through a covered walkway. You may want to leave your coat in the car for convenience. Self serve coat checks are available but not secured.

Valet Parking

There are two locations to valet park, from the hotel entrance and Motor City Lobby on W. Renaissance Drive or from the Wintergarden entrance on Atwater Drive. The most convenient access to the Marriott Hotel and the Annual Convention is the hotel entrance.

- Cost: \$25 per day.
- Picking up: Vehicles can be retrieved at either entrance, with a minimum of a 15-minute wait. There is a kiosk in the hotel lobby to request pickup.

Register Early and Save!

Pharmacists and technicians—Check the registration form for various registration rates and discount deadlines. Discounts will be based upon fax or postmark dates. Full payment must accompany the registration form to qualify for discounts. Regular rates apply to those registering after Feb. 4, 2010, and to those registering onsite. Attention pre-registrants—any 1-day or 2-day registrant (where Sunday is included) may take an additional \$25 discount. Discounts do not apply to registrations received after Feb. 4, 2010.

Cancellations

All requests for refunds must be received in writing by Feb. 5, 2010 (postmark or fax date). Cancellations or registration modifications resulting in a refund received from Feb. 6 through Feb. 15, 2010, will be assessed a \$50 administrative fee. Cancellations after Feb. 15, 2009, no shows or changes made onsite to registration will not be refunded. Refunds will not be given for inclement weather, nor will refunds be given due to registration errors made by the participant.

Program Restrictions

Due to health and safety concerns, children under 16 years of age will not be allowed in the educational sessions or Exhibit Hall.

PROGRAM ACCREDITATION

Continuous Professional Development

CPD

The profession of pharmacy is moving in a direction that focuses on continuous professional development (CPD) for pharmacists and pharmacy technicians. MPA plays a critical role in CPD and aims to provide continuing education programs that support the continued development of pharmacy professionals and enhance competency.

Many educational programs at the MPA Annual Convention & Exposition are an acceptable method for certified pharmacy technicians and pharmacists to obtain pharmacy continuing education (PCE) credit. In an effort to assist you in targeting programs that will lend to your professional development, as well as adhering to the Accreditation Council of Pharmacy Education's (ACPE) Continuing Pharmacy Education Standards, every PCE program listed in this brochure will identify the appropriate audience in conjunction with the program number with a P (pharmacist) or T (technician). Pharmacy technician-specific programming will likely be geared toward their scope of responsibilities. Pharmacists attending programs with a technician-only designation will not be eligible for PCE credit. Pharmacy technicians attending programs with a pharmacist-only designation will not be eligible for PCE credit. Many of the programs, however, will be accredited for both audiences, either by ACPE accreditation standards that meet pharmacist requirements or by PTCE accreditation standards that meet the certification guidelines for pharmacy technicians. However, even though MPA may accredit a program for technicians, it is the technician's responsibility to determine whether the subject matter is acceptable to the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) for recertification.

PTCB has designated the following topics as appropriate:

- Medication distribution and inventory control systems
- Pharmacy administration and management calculations
- Programs specific to pharmacy technicians
- Interpersonal skills
- Organizational skills
- Pharmacy law
- Pharmacology/drug therapy

Programs relating to functions outside the scope of practice for pharmacy technicians are not accepted by PTCB.

These programs are structured to meet knowledge- and application-based educational needs of pharmacists and technicians. A knowledge-based activity acquires factual knowledge, and information is based on evidence as accepted in literature by the health care professions. Application-based activity applies to information learned in the timeframe allotted. Information is based on evidence as accepted in the literature by the health care professions.

Convention Objectives

At the end of the convention, participants should be able to describe the future of pharmacy and implement strategies to affect pharmacy in their practice setting. Participants should also be able to identify areas related to pharmacy that would enhance their professional development, as well as discuss at least one new therapeutic option revealed at the convention.

PCE Credit

The following outlines the procedures for appropriately earning pharmacy continuing education (PCE) credit according to standards established by ACPE. Please review them thoroughly. Michigan Pharmacists Association will not be held responsible for individuals not adhering to these guidelines.

• **Posttest Examinations**—Continuing education program attendees will be required to complete posttest questions online by March 15, 2010, for programs that are designated as knowledge-based only. Posttest questions are not applicable to application-based programs. Detailed instructions will be given to participants in the final convention

brochure distributed at the event. Participants must pass each posttest with a score of 70 percent or greater. Individuals not able to complete this requirement online can request hard copies of evaluation forms and posttests at the Ambassador Relations Desk before 2 p.m. on Sunday or after the Convention, but before March 5, 2010.

• **Continuing Education Attendance Form**—Each registrant packet will contain a Continuing Education Attendance Form that you will use to record all continuing education sessions that you attend throughout the convention. Simply fill in the circles that represent the programs in which you fully participated. Your name and address are required, so please fill out this form appropriately. If programs occurring at the same time are indicated, credit will not be awarded for either program. PCE credit will not be awarded if the completed pink and white portions of this form are not placed in designated drop boxes at the Convention. Participants should retain the yellow portion until the official statement of credit is received in the mail. Individuals submitting or mailing their Continuing Education Attendance Form to MPA for validation after 2 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 28, 2010, will be charged a \$10 processing fee. Continuing Education Attendance Forms will be accepted until April 2, 2010. Forms submitted after April 2, 2010, will not be accepted or valid.

• **Drop Box**—Just prior to leaving the convention for the weekend, place the pink and white original completed Continuing Education Attendance Form in one of the various drop boxes marked "Continuing Education Attendance Forms." All Continuing Education Attendance Forms must be placed in a drop box by 2 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 28, 2010. Drop boxes will be located in various locations throughout the hotel.

Program Evaluations

Program evaluations are also located online. Participants are requested to complete the evaluations so that we can use the information to plan more successful continuing education opportunities. Evaluation forms will not be accessible after March 15, 2010.

Statements of Credit

MPA will mail continuing education statements of credit to convention registrants meeting the requirements approximately eight to 10 weeks following the convention. Statements of credit will not be mailed to individuals who have not paid in full. Credit will not be granted to participants who claim to have attended programs on days for which they were not registered.

Attendance and active participation in a session are required to obtain PCE credit. Monitors stationed at the entrance to all programs will inform anyone who is more than 10 minutes late to a program that PCE credit is no longer available and will not distribute posttest questions. This procedure will be strictly enforced, so please plan accordingly. To ensure active participation in all programs, MPA may compare Continuing Education Attendance Forms with submitted evaluations and posttest examinations. In the event an evaluation is not submitted or posttest questions aren't answered for programs indicated on the Continuing Education Attendance Form, MPA retains the authority to deny PCE credit.

Required CE

As of July 2007, pharmacists are required to earn 10 hours of live PCE credit and one hour of pain PCE credit, both requirements inclusive of the 30 hours normally earned. Certified pharmacy technicians must obtain one hour of pharmacy law continuing education credit every two years. Michigan pharmacists are not required to obtain pharmacy law continuing education credit. For pharmacists needing to fulfill the requirement of obtaining 10 hours of live PCE, the convention offers more than 20 hours of live PCE credit.

Additionally, based on regulations found in the Medicare Part D Program to Control Fraud, Waste and Abuse and recent clarifications from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), all individuals employed by the pharmacy who have any interaction with a Part D beneficiary must receive specialized compliance training (pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, cashiers, drivers, etc.). Training must be completed yearly to meet the requirement (Jan. 1-Dec. 31). Training completed prior to Jan. 1 does not meet the requirement for the next calendar year. A record of all fraud, waste and abuse training must be maintained for a minimum of 10 years and be made available to CMS upon request. Several Part D plan sponsors have requested documentation of pharmacy staff fraud, waste and abuse training. Continuing education programs covering the topic of Medicare Part D and fraud, waste and abuse may qualify for compliance training.

Continuing education programs that meet pain and law and may meet fraud, waste and abuse regulations will be identified in the final convention brochure.
